Understanding Trauma and Supporting the Needs of People Fleeing War or **Persecution**: Free Training Available until September

Understanding trauma and supporting the needs of people fleeing war and / or persecution









HSE Cork Kerry Community Healthcare in conjunction with the HSE National Social Inclusion Office and HSE Mental Health delivered this free on-line training.

Who is this training for?

This training is for anyone working with or supporting children, adults or families who have fled war and / or persecution, including those providing support to people who have arrived in Ireland from Ukraine and all other people seeking International Protection here in Ireland. It is suitable for people working in Statutory and Non-Statutory organisations such as the HSE, Child and Family Agency, Department of Education and Science, Department of Social Protection, Department of Justice, NGO's and community support services.

What are the learning goals?

Participants will leave with an awareness / basic understanding of the following:

- War trauma and Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)
- The psychosocial needs of people who have fled war and are adjusting to a new life in Ireland
- Understanding the barriers that interfere with people accessing and benefitting from supports
- Helpful do's and don'ts when working with people who have survived war trauma
- When and where to get help for trauma / PTSD
- Understanding the importance of minding your own psychological wellbeing when helping others

Trainer

Dr. Jennifer Hayes in Principal Psychology Manager for Social Inclusion in Cork Kerry Community Healthcare. She is a qualified clinical psychologist and a counselling psychologist and has supported children, adults and families across multiple services in the HSE for almost 20 years. Over the last number of years she has worked extensively with Syrian and Iraqi war survivors living in Ireland as part of the Resettlement Project. Her area of clinical expertise is trauma, PTSD and supporting people who have fled war and persecution are resettling in Ireland. She has represented the HSE on selection missions with Department of Justice on to Lebanon, Jordan and Greece. In her downtime she plays Gaelic football with Gaelic for Mothers and Others and is an avid Cork hurling supporter.

About AIM

The Access and Inclusion Model (AIM) ensures all children, regardless of disability can fully take part in mainstream pre-school. AIM helps pre-schools create an inclusive environment and provides supports to children to

meaningfully participate in ECCE, the two year state funded preschool programme.

AIM provides universal and targeted supports to pre-school settings that focus on the needs of the individual child. AIM is a Department of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth (DCEIDY) initiative, administered by Pobal and Better Start AIM.

About Progressing Disability Services

Progressing Disability Services (PDS) is a change programme by the HSE and Voluntary agencies, reconfiguring the delivery of children's services all over the country. Some children with a disability or developmental delay will receive their support from their local Primary Care services. Other children with more complex needs will receive their support from newly configured Children's Disability Network Teams (CDNTs).

Each service will work with families to address their individual. needs. Services will work to help children to participate to the best of their ability in all aspect of their lives. The Progressing Disability Services programme draws from extensive research and is in line with Sláintecare.

One Family Parenting Courses





The courses have video content from One Family staff plus additional learning resources to help you make the most of your learning time. Parents can monitor their own progress and engage in as many courses as they wish as the one time. These courses have specific content for those parenting alone or sharing parenting but in general the programme supports all family forms.

We offer five e-learning courses for parents. These courses support parents parenting toddlers through to teens. We also offer a course specifically aimed at supporting parents post separation.

O The Kinia Tech Tour



Kinia are headed on a journey across the country, to deliver Creative Technology Training to adult learners and community volunteers. The Kinia Tech Tour will feature a blend of in person and online training events, introducing you to Mobile Filmmaking, Podcasting, Coding, STEAM, Circuitry, 3D Printing and Robotics.

All programmes will be offered through the English and/or Irish and are sponsored "Train the Trainer" sessions, which means free of charge, provided participants are over 18 years of age and working with young people in a voluntary/paid capacity.

In-person training will take place in a 1 day session at a regional venue. Online training will be over 2 sessions through an online conference call (online participants must attend both sessions).

There are 4 introductory training topics on offer Computer Science, STEAM, Mobile Filmmaking and Podcasting..

FUNDING

o Ireland for Ukraine Fund: Community Foundation for Ireland



The 'Ireland for Ukraine' campaign aims to raise funds for people affected by the conflict, which includes those who have been displaced.

The objectives of this fund are:

- To support local, regional and national organisations to <u>adapt</u> their work to respond to the emerging and medium-term needs of refugees fleeing Ukraine
- To allow for greater collaboration and coordination across the sector to respond to the crisis in a more effective, impactful way
- To ensure voices and agency of the beneficiary refugees is encouraged through the projects funded

Irish organisations working with refugees from Ukraine at a local, regional and national level can apply for a grant under the following strands:

- Primary Response
- Community Response
- Specialised Response
- Collaborative Response

Organisations can apply <u>once</u> to <u>one</u> of the Strands above.

All applications must meet the criteria for the Fund, any organisation or project that does not meet the eligibility criteria will not be successful in this grant round.

It is recommended that organisations read through each criteria document before making a decision about applying, Closing date for receipt of applications is 30th June 2022. Grants will be awarded in September 2022 and work should begin in September / October 2022.

Minister O'Gorman publishes Ireland's EU Child Guarantee National Action Plan



The Minister for Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth, Roderic O'Gorman, today published Ireland's National Action Plan for the EU Child Guarantee.

In 2019, the European Commission announced the creation of a European Child Guarantee with a view to ensuring that every child in Europe at risk of poverty or social exclusion has access to the most basic of rights like healthcare and education. The objective of the European Child Guarantee, which was adopted by the Council in June 2021, is to prevent and combat social exclusion by guaranteeing the access of children in need to a set of key services:

- early childhood education and care
- education (including school-based activities)
- healthcare
- nutrition
- housing

Government agreed on 31 May to the publication of the National Action Plan and for its submission to the EU Commission.

The publication of the Plan is an important first step in the implementation of the EU Child Guarantee.

Minister O'Gorman noted:

"My Department will coordinate actions across Government in addition to holding responsibility for the delivery of actions contained in this Plan relating to Early Childhood

Education and Care, while the delivery of other key actions in the plan will be managed by the parent Department holding policy and operational responsibility.

"By and large, the Plan references policies, programmes and interventions that are already State funded and are operational. Of particular note is that Exchequer funding, of the quantum of €7.8bn, is annually spent in areas aligned to the EU Child Guarantee. This is just a first step.

"Identifying the most appropriate and effective structures to pursue the reforms necessary to improve outcomes for our most disadvantaged children and young people will be a particular focus of our work in the coming months, in order to progress matters.

"Finally, while the Plan does not contain specific reference to the crises in Ukraine and the resultant impact on children, I have written to the EU Commission in this regard – noting that we consider the EU Child Guarantee to encompass such children and we will act accordingly."
