→ Dr. Mary O'Kane : Parenting Talks & Resources



Dr Mary O'Kane is a Lecturer in Psychology and Early Childhood Education teaching with the Open University. Popular for sharing her expertise in a warm and relatable way, Mary is a regular contributor to <u>Ireland AM</u> on both parenting and early childhood education issues. She gives public talks on a range of topics related to child wellbeing, parenting, and education, and is well known for her humorous down to earth approach.

I am doing 3 Parent Webinars for Canavan Byrne this Spring, and details are as follows:

On Wednesday 24th January, we have **Supporting Anxious Children**. This is aimed at parents of children from preschool through to teens. As parents, when your child is anxious it can be difficult to know how best to support them. However, we play an important role in helping our children to both understand and to manage their anxiety. In this talk I will explain anxiety in children and outline very practical advice on how we can help our children to manage their fears and gain confidence. Further details <u>here</u>.

On 21st February we have **From Surviving to Thriving: Developing a Growth Mindset in Children**. This is aimed at parents who would say their child can veer towards the negative, a child maybe who does not seem to want to put effort into tasks, and outlines how we can help them to reach their full potential. Then we have **Parenting Tweens and Teens**. This Webinar outlines the impact of teenage brain development, which explains so much of why we sometimes find our teens hard to understand! I then offer practical advice on how to maintain family connection during these years. This will take place on Wednesday 13th March. Details available here.

I am also doing a **Webinar on Supporting Anxious Children for Educators** on 1st May: Educators play an important role in helping children to both understand and manage their anxiety. In this Webinar we talk about how to support anxious children in educational settings, helping them to manage their fears and gain confidence. Details are available <u>here</u>.

My exciting news is that my new book: 'Anxious Children in an Anxious World' It is due to be released in April 2024. This book is aimed at parents, carers, and educators of children from preschool through to teenage years. Adults in the lives of children for whom anxiety is impacting on their ability to reach their full potential. It will also help adults in the lives of sensitive children, who want to cultivate the resilience they need to thrive in this anxious world. It is the book that I wish I had read when my children were little. Do keep an eye on my social media, I will be sharing further details nearer the time!

Finally, for any of you that might have felt under pressure with your parenting over the Christmas break, I just wanted to remind you that 'good enough is good enough'. Every so often we all need a reminder that there is no need to be perfect in our parenting, all we can do is to try our best with what we know at the time. You are exactly the parent your child needs, flaws, imperfections, and all.

The Children's Rights Alliance Annual Report Card tracks how the Government is delivering on its commitments to children in the Programme for Government. The Alliance first published the Report Card in 2009 and it is now in its 15th edition. The Alliance introduced the Report Card to have a monitoring tool in between examinations under the UNCRC

How has the Government progressed on its commitments to children in 2023? Did it keep its promises in important areas like health, housing, education, poverty, equality and early years? Will they get an 'A' or an 'F' grade? A 'C' or a 'C+'

Find out at the launch of *Report Card 2024* – the fourth analysis of the <u>Programme for Government: Our Shared Future</u> and our collective opportunity to ensure children's rights are safeguarded and promoted in this Government's vision for Ireland.
