

BUILDING A FORCE FOR GOOD THROUGH YOUTH-LED SOCIAL INNOVATION

Young Social Innovators has been promoting social innovation education in Ireland since its establishment in 2001. Our purpose is to fire young people's passion to change the world for good and to empower them to take creative and collaborative action on social issues facing them, their communities and wider society.

Our unique social innovation framework puts young people in the driving seat. It asks them to examine the world through a new lens and to reimagine the type of society they would like to live in - one that is more caring, equal and fair.

But more than that, it challenges them to put their ideas into action and to bring their vision to reality. In this way, young people realise their own capacity to effect change in the world around them.

Our programme at Senior Cycle engages thousands of students every year equipping them with knowledge, skills and experience unique to this type of learning and practice.

Schools in targeted regions can now benefit from increased opportunities, engagement and support from Young Social Innovators as they come together as part of Local Community Networks, sharing ideas, resources, learning and experience.

Each year, new regions will be supported by YSI Local Leaders who will enable school and inter-school collaboration by facilitating Teach Meets, student workshops, network events and local recognition for young people.

SOCIAL INNOVATION ACTION PROGRAMME: SENIOR CYCLE

The Social Innovation Action programme at Senior Cycle enables students (aged 15-18) to work in teams to explore social issues that concern them and to develop and implement creative responses to those they feel passionately about.


Learning is youth-led and action-based, infused with an understanding of human rights, social justice, citizenship and sustainability.

Supported by teacher training and world class resources, the programme promotes youth participation and youth voice as well as developing critical and creative skills required for life and work in the 21st century.

Events and platforms to amplify the issues and voice of young people and to recognise their participation are offered as part of this in-depth programme.

- PART 1 - INTRODUCING SOCIAL INNOVATION**
Students explore what social innovation means, discover global examples of innovation for social good and identify their own abilities to be social innovators.
- PART 2 - EXPLORE & CREATE**
Students identify social issues, explore them and select one to take action on. They work together to create a vision for change and a big idea to bring that vision to reality.
- PART 3 - TEST & ADAPT**
Students use human-centred design and design for sustainable development to test and adapt their ideas.
- PART 4 - ACT & REFLECT**
Students work with others in their community to roll out their ideas and present their project at a regional Speak Out event and during #YSIweek
- PART 5 - RECOGNISE & CELEBRATE**
Students evaluate and report on their work submitting an online portfolio on which feedback and certification is provided.

PLATFORMS AND EVENTS



YSI Den
Teams have the option of applying for further support to increase the impact of their innovation through the YSI Den. Money, means or mentoring can be requested through the Den from YSI's Social Innovation Fund.



Speak Out Tour

Teams present their project to a YSI Panel and audience of their peers using creative communications highlighting the need for and impact of their social innovation.



#YSIweek

Teams host a community event to showcase their project locally. Shared on social media, YSI amplifies their work through its digital platforms.



Young Social Innovators of the Year Awards

Teams can enter into the annual Young Social Innovators of the Year Ireland Awards at the end of the academic year. Selected finalists attend and compete for our Title and Challenge Awards.

LET'S TALK ABOUT CONSENT

Bush Post Primary School
Dundalk, Co. Louth

Aimed at helping young people to understand the meaning of consent in an accessible way, students produced an animated video and podcast and engaged with national media to communicate about the issue.



WE ARE ALL HUMAN

Largy College
Clones, Co. Monaghan

Focused on promoting inclusion for asylum seekers and refugees, the team raised awareness in their local community in creative ways. Working with Monaghan County Council, they created and developed an app to provide information in various languages for newcomers to their area.



GREENER GLOBE

Tullamore College
Tullamore, Co. Offaly

Motivated to reduce water wastage, the team developed an innovative shower head that encourages users to conserve water by taking shorter showers.



MISSING PERSONS

Davis College
Mallow, Co. Cork

Moved by the plight of families of missing people in Ireland, the team lobbied the Government to introduce a national day of remembrance. The high impact campaign resulted in the establishment of a National Missing Persons Day in Ireland which takes place each December.
