Wexford Youth Film Festival are delighted to announce that submissions for the 2021 festival are now being accepted!

The film festival is aimed at Primary and Secondary school aged pupils from around the Wexford area or with a connection or an interest in Wexford.

So if you have made a short film, or would like to make one especially for the festival we'd love to hear from you! Whether you are a young aspiring filmmaker or you are part of a school, or youth group, get your film to us to be part of this year's festival. Every type of film is welcome, including fiction, documentary, animation and music videos. The theme of the festival is 'A celebration of identity and the importance of belonging and inclusion with a focus on community integration'. The short films should look to examine themes of cultural similarities, race, disability, gender and to explore the challenges faced across all sections of the community.

#### How to enter:

Follow the instructions below to submit your film free of charge.

- 1. Upload your short film to YouTube or Vimeo and put it as unlisted.
- 2. Films can be between 1 and 10 minutes in duration.
- 3. Films can be of any type. Fiction, Documentary, Comedy, Drama, Environmental, Animation and Music videos.
- 4. Make sure to put the details in the description section on the chosen platform.
- 5. Email the unlisted link along with your details to John Ó Faoláin at wexfordyouthfilmfestival@gmail.com
- 6. State in the email if you are an individual filmmaker or with a youth group, film club or a primary or secondary school.

Closing dates for entries is 16th of October 2021.

A panel will select 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each age category and the winners will be screened at an event in late October.

Prizes and certificates will be awarded to the winners in each category.

All films submitted will be shared on our Facebook page over the coming months.

To be eligible for inclusion film entries must be:

- The original work of schools, groups or pindividuals aged from 7 to 18
- Completed after 1st January 2016
- Films can be between 1 and 10 minutes in duration

## Parenting Today 2021: Back to School Anxiety: Supporting your child or teenager as they return to school Presented by Dr Malie Coyne

Worrying and parenting go hand in hand, especially during times of change, and the return to school after summer break can bring simmering anxieties to the surface for children, teenagers and parents alike.

Join Wexford Library Services and CYPSC Wexford for an online talk with Dr. Malie Coyne, Senior Clinical Psychologist and Author, where she will speak about the anxiety children face in returning to school, and share practical suggestions using her SAFE compassionate approach from her critically acclaimed book 'Love in, Love Out: A compassionate approach to parenting your anxious child. Malie will also dedicate time to answering <u>your</u> questions. Malie's approach is very down to earth, which stems from her experience as an anxious child, from being an 'at times' struggling parent, and from offering support to many anxious children and parents over the years. It is hoped you'll be left with a sense of reassurance as a parent or carer, and some very practical tools to help you and your children.

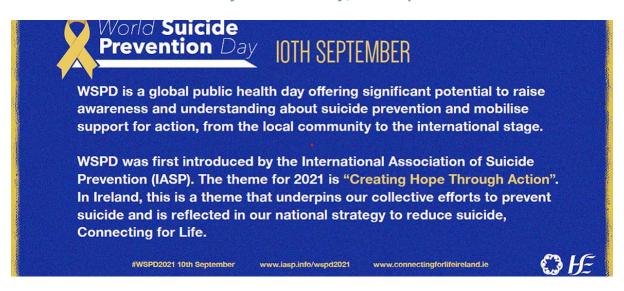






#### World Suicide Prevention Day

The <u>International Association of Suicide Prevention</u>'s 2021 theme is "Creating Hope Through Action".

Our national suicide prevention strategy, <u>Connecting for Life</u>, reflects this theme.

The HSE National Office for Suicide Prevention (NOSP) has provided a <u>Partner Pack for WSPD 2021</u>. It contains social media images, recommended messaging, and suggested actions you can take to create hope.
