I am emailing to **ask for your help** to spread the word about this programme to people who could benefit from attending.

The Supporter's Programme is for anyone who is working/volunteering in an organisation and is supporting someone who is struggling with their mental health. The programme teaches supporters **practical skills** they can use to support others, it gives information on what supports are available and how they can be accessed and teaches practical ways of looking after your own mental health while supporting someone else.

Participants have said that alongside the practical skills learned the programme has increased their confidence in their existing support skills, helped them to focus more on self-care, and provided an opportunity for them to connect with others who are in a supporter role, so they feel less alone.

FUNDING

→ Ireland Against Racism Funding Call

- €1 million is being made available to applicant groups operating at national, regional and local level to support the implementation of the National Action Plan Against Racism
- The overall objective of this fund is to provide funding for national and regional projects, as well as local initiatives, that aim to combat racism and foster racial equality and community cohesion
- The grant scheme is open to applications from existing non-government organisations and community organisations that have a specific focus on anti-racism initiatives

The Ireland Against Racism funding call is an important element in supporting the implementation of the National Action Plan Against Racism. The funding call arises from Action 2.14 of the plan which states: **“Provide funding for national and local initiatives that aim to combat racism and foster racial equality and community cohesion, in order to support the implementation of this plan and the achievement of its objectives”.**

There are two streams of funding:

- **Scheme A** will provide grants, ranging from €50,000 to €100,000, to organisations for national and regional projects.
- **Scheme B** will provide grants, ranging from €5,000 to €10,000, to organisations for local projects.

All applications must be submitted electronically.

Applications for funding will remain open until noon on 31 May. Groups can access a detailed guidance document and complete an online application form at the following links:

→ **Mná na hÉireann Women of Ireland empowerment Fund 2023 – 2026**
Rethink Ireland



The Mná na hÉireann, Women of Ireland Empowerment Fund 2023 – 2026 is a \$1 million, three-year fund created by Rethink Ireland in partnership with Bank of America and the Department of Rural and Community Development via the Dormant Accounts Fund.

Building on the success of the previous Mná na hÉireann, Women of Ireland Fund 2019 – 2022, Rethink Ireland is now launching the Mná na hÉireann, Women of Ireland Empowerment Fund that aims to support women facing intersecting forms of disadvantage into sustainable employment and educational pathways. The Mná na hÉireann, Women of Ireland Empowerment Fund will be focused on achieving deep and transformative impact by supporting women experiencing intersectionality – multiple forms of disadvantage and discrimination – with complex needs. Women facing intersecting forms of disadvantage are the furthest from the labour market and benefit from intensive wraparound support to enable them to transition into employment or education.

The Fund's goal is to promote access to employment and/or education programmes for 850+ migrant women OR women experiencing socio-economic disadvantage in Ireland. Furthermore, the Fund aims to empower 260+ of these women into employment.

The Fund offers a package of cash grants and non-financial supports to the value of €175,500 for up to 4 to 5 projects, to help them expand and increase their social impact.

This includes:

- 4 to 5 awards of up to €153,000
- The non-financial supports will include:
 - a place on Rethink Ireland's Accelerator Programme
 - bespoke business and capacity building supports designed in consultation with the successful projects on topics such as strategic planning, maximising your impact, communications, storytelling and fundraising.
- Access to Rethink Ireland's networks.

* The Rethink Ireland Board will decide how much money to award, which may be less than the amount requested. The final amount of the award will depend on how many organisations are selected.
