The Supporter's Programme is for anyone supporting a family member, friend, or neighbour who is struggling with their mental health. The programme teaches supporters practical skills they can use to support others, it gives information on what supports are available and how they can be accessed and teaches practical ways of looking after your own mental health while supporting someone else.

Participants have said that alongside the practical skills learned the programme has increased their confidence in their existing support skills, helped them to focus more on self-care, and provided an opportunity for them to connect with others who are in a supporter role, so they feel less alone.

The **Connect Safely Programme** promotes safer use of digital resources, equipping young people with the skills to safely benefit from being online, while also empowering young people to safely participate in their online communities as positive digital citizens.

The programme has been developed to engage young people in safe, creative, digital learning experiences where they can learn, connect, be informed and be creative. It is important that young people experience all the opportunities the internet offers and that they can do so in a way that is safe and as positive as can be.

The programme includes topics such as:

- Privacy Settings

- Gaming/Gambling

FUNDING

→ St Stephen's Green Trust: Supporting Vulnerable Women and Families in the International Protection Process



In 2023, SSGT launched a new funding programme aimed at supporting the most vulnerable women and families in the IP process including: lone parents, families with children who have additional needs, women and children who have survived abuse, victims of sex trafficking and families with deportation orders who do not have access to adequate financial or social supports.

The programme includes two funding strands and supports work in Ireland and in Northern Ireland. In **Strand 1**, one-year grants of between €5,000 (£4,500) and €8,000 (£7,500) will be offered to local groups working to improve the living conditions and pathways to support for the target beneficiaries. **Strand 2** will welcome applications for up to €20,000 (£17,500) per annum for up to three years from groups working strategically to improve the situation of vulnerable women and families in the long-term.

→ Wexford Local Economic and Community Plan Public Consultation - Have your say



Colleagues,

Wexford County Council is preparing a new Local Economic & Community Plan for the period 2023-2028. We are inviting you to have your say in shaping the future economic, social and community development of County Wexford.

The LECP consultation phase has now commenced and the public and stakeholders are invited to engage in the process to –

- identify the programs that will see our county develop and grow.
- the opportunities, and challenges you face, across the county that affect your lives.

The purpose of the LECP is to set out the objectives and actions needed to promote the economic development and community development of County Wexford, both by the local authority directly, and in partnership with other economic and community development stakeholders.

This consultation will seek the views of people living in the five Municipal District (MD) areas of County Wexford, as well as representatives from the public, private and community sectors.

As part of our consultation programme, we would like to hear your views on the draft high level goals and the sustainable community and economic objectives set out within it, alongside your desired outcomes and vision for County Wexford.

If you cannot make any of the in-person events an online consultation session will also take place 20th of March 2023 at 7.00pm

In addition to the public events, a series of structured interviews, workshops and focus groups are being scheduled with key stakeholders (elected members ,council representatives, sector representatives, state and semi-state agencies and private sector bodies) the aim of which is to build up a detailed on the ground understanding of County Wexford – its existing strengths and constraints, as well as opportunities available to the County and will allow for the development of an LECP that is reflective and representative of the interests of Wexford's communities and businesses.

Your views will help to shape the direction the next Local Economic & Community Plan will take. This consultation will form stage one of the consultation process alongside two online surveys (one for the community and one for the business sector).

Both surveys are now open and will be available until Saturday April 08th 2023

All submissions/observations lodged within the above consultation period will be take into consideration during the preparation of the new Local Economic & Community Plan.
