Presenter Bio's

Session 1: Understanding the Impact of Trauma on Children's Behaviour



This session will be presented by Sharon Byrne from Barnardos & is suitable for those who are interested in learning about the impact trauma and adversity can have on young children's behaviour. The aim of this session is to introduce participants to the impact early adversity can have on children's behaviour and the importance of providing a trauma informed response in early learning and care settings.

Session 2 :Understanding and Creating Strategies for challenging behaviour in School Age Childcare



Dermot Rafter has over 30 years' experience of working on individual support and organisation development and training, with qualifications and competencies in Positive Behaviour Support (PBS); Person Centred Practice (PCP); Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA); and Cognitive Behaviour Therapy (CBT). He is a trained instructor in non-violent verbal and physical intervention strategies and has recently been accredited as a trainer of Professional, Ethical, Therapeutic Management of Aggression (PETMA®) with the National Institute for Intellectual Disabilities. Dermot has developed a model of Positive Behaviour Suppport, (UPR) which he will outline during his presentation. Currently, Dermot lectures on a course in positive behaviour support in SETU.

Each year in Ireland around 500 people (CSO 2020) take their own life – each suicide has a devastating and lasting impact on the families, friends and communities of those who died.

In January 2016, 11-year-old Milly Tuomey died by suicide. Devastated by her sudden death, Milly's mother Fiona searched for a suicide support group in Dublin to help her with her grief but could not find one. So, in 2017, the first <a href="https://documents.org/linear-new-normalized-new-n
