The R&R project involves doing youth work outside of the usual youth work -space in order to engage young people in a service, provide information on other services available to them and support them in realising and reaching their full potential. Gorey Youth Needs Group	During Lockdown GYNG were still in operation however services were redesigned in a way that they could be delivered online using various platforms, mainly Zoom and Discord. The Facebook page was also very active and the messaging service allowed young people to have a direct line with Youth Workers. GYNG followed official Guidance for the Youth Sector and service provision changed based on the phases in the Government's Road Map out of Lockdown. On the 8 th of June small groups of four resumed face to face and this then increased to groups of 12 outdoors. As of the 24 th of August Official Guidance for Youth Organisations on resuming full service now permits GYNG to facilitate group work indoors with groups of 12. One to one work with targeted and those identified as at risk continues, over telephone.</p> <p>The Young Women’s Project is based in Wexford town and surrounds. We support young women and young mother’s aged 15-25, many of whom are going through crisis in their lives.</p> <p>We offer one to one support and often signpost (hand hold) young women to other services and professionals who we feel meet their needs. Young women and young mothers also have the opportunity to join groups in the project; some groups can be as small as two or as large as ten depending on the level of need and issues in the group.</p> <p>The focus of these groups is mainly about personal and social development. Once in the group many young women say they feel less alone, supported and listened to. They develop positive relationships, gain support from each other; they also learn coping mechanisms and strategies in a fun and safe environment.
