## specific route two days per week (Tuesday and Wednesday) where young people meet and are open to feedback from the local community as to new areas in which young people are congregating.

## LGBT+ Youth Project

The LGBT+ youth project in FDYS is still operating, with our work staying the same, and how we are doing it is slightly different. We have three LGBT+ youth projects running online at present. LGBT+ Wexford Youth runs every Thursday via Google Hangouts from 6-7:30 for ages 14+. SOLIDARITY LGBT+ Enniscorthy runs each Wednesday via Google Hangouts from 4-6pm. Wexford and Enniscorthy LGBT+ Action group (combining the Wexford and Enniscorthy group) runs bi-weekly on a Wednesday from 4-6pm. All groups are safe, open, welcoming, inclusive and non-judgemental spaces for young LGBT+ people to express their authentic selves and to meet other young people who may be on similar journeys. We engage in exciting LGBT+ related projects and the group is a good space to check in weekly on how people are doing. You do not need to be sure of your sexual orientation and/or gender identity to join and you are accepted just as you are in our space, always.

We offer one to one sessions and chats to young LGBT+ people or young people who are questioning.
